Celebrations for NSW RFS State Championship winners

The exceptional performances seen in the 2018 NSW Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS) State Championships was celebrated this afternoon with the announcement of winners and the official handover of the major prize, a new community support vehicle for the Hawkesbury District.

NSW RFS Commissioner Shane Fitzsimmons said volunteers competed across the weekend in a series of simulated emergency situations where their skills and equipment were put to the test, at the event held in Temora.

"With scenarios ranging from simulated motor vehicle accidents to bush, grass and structure fires, all competing teams demonstrated their training, dedication and professionalism," Commissioner Fitzsimmons said.

"The Oakville Brigade team were crowned State Champions after competing against 13 other teams.
