Lifetime commitment to Trajere and Nyrang Creek Brigades

The dedication of local volunteers in the Eugowra area was acknowledged during a recent medal ceremony for the Trajere and Nyrang Creek Brigades.

33 recipients were awarded medals, with the total years of service totalling 1347.

Canobolas Zone Manager, Superintendent David Hoadley said the awarding of so many medals for such a long period of service was testimony to the dedication of all the local brigade members.

"There were two families, the 'Herberts' and 'Townsends', who have been involved with the brigades since they were started back in 1928 and they continue to take an active role in the two brigades operations," Superintendent Hoadley said.

"It's so pleasing to see so many people being acknowledged for their commitment to supporting and protecting the local community during a time of greatest need.

"The willingness and readiness of the members to attend a blaze was demonstrated during the Nangar road fire in January of this year, when the local brigades contained a major blaze in mountainous country to just over 220 hectares.

"They worked together rapidly to contain the blaze under adverse weather conditions and in rugged terrain and successfully protected properties from damage."
