The NSW Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS) Illawarra District will tonight recognise and celebrate the dedication and commitment of long serving members.

Member for Kiama Gareth Ward and NSW RFS Assistant Commissioner Stuart Midgley AFSM will join local volunteers to present two National Medals and two National Medals and 24 Long Service Medals at a special ceremony to be held at the Illawarra Fire Control Centre.

"These members do not volunteer their time for the accolades, however these medals are a proud acknowledgement of the commitment shown by these individuals over the years," Mr Ward said.

"Curly has been a dedicated volunteer member of the NSW RFS for 62 years after first joining Albion Park Brigade in 1957 where he is now a Life Member and is also now a member of Calderwood Brigade," Assistant Commissioner Midgley said.

"Over his six decades with the Service, he has fought fires locally and assisted communities further afield.

"Curly continues to be a dedicated member of his brigades and has been a pillar of the work they do within the community."

Assistant Commissioner Midgley also acknowledged the contribution of John Bourke, who will receive the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Clasp of his Long Service Medal in recognition of his 45 years of service.

"John joined the Mt Kembla Brigade in 1974 was elected Captain for nine years from 1980.

"He is a well-respected and an integral part his team, mentoring other members and assisting where he can."

Assistant Commissioner Midgley said that each volunteer being recognised tonight has demonstrated an exceptional level of commitment to their community.

"I offer my sincere thanks and gratitude to all the NSW RFS staff and volunteers who continue to work hard for their communities," Assistant Commissioner Midgley said.
