Northholm Grammar School cadets celebrate graduation

Sixteen students from Northholm Grammar School in Arcadia have today been congratulated for their successful completion of the NSW Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS) Secondary School Cadet Program.

Member for Hornsby Matt Kean, who attended the graduation ceremony at the school, said the program is the ideal way to introduce young people to the important role volunteer firefighter's play within communities.

"These cadets have completed a nine week course that has given them skills which will last a lifetime," Mr Kean said.

"As well as examining fire behaviour, the students have been taught essential fire safety techniques and gained an appreciation of the work our emergency services do every day in this state.

"The cadet program also offers students the opportunity to experience firsthand the commitment and camaraderie that comes with volunteering."

NSW RFS District Manager Superintendent Mark Sugden said this is the eighth time Northholm Grammar School has offered the NSW RFS Secondary School Cadet Program to its students.
