Celebrations for Far West Team with veteran volunteers, station opening and a new tanker

NSW Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS) Far West Team have recognised the achievements of veteran volunteers, celebrated the official opening of a new fire station and the handover of a new vehicle today.

At a ceremony held in Goodooga, NSW RFS Assistant Commissioner Steve York presented 17 Long Service Medals and two National Medals to volunteers in recognition of their ongoing commitment to the local community.

The 19 medal recipients have accumulated a total of 423 years of service between them, with six members having dedicated more than 30 years to their brigade.

"Each of the volunteers being recognised has demonstrated an exceptional level of commitment to their community over the years and these medals are our proud acknowledgement of their efforts," Assistant Commissioner Yorke said.
