Tuncurry RFS volunteers celebrate new tanker

NSW Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS) Mid Coast District today celebrated the official handover of a new tanker for the Tuncurry Rural Fire Brigade.

Stephen Bromhead MP, State Member for Myall Lakes, joined NSW RFS Acting District Manager, Insp. Guy Duckworth and Council officials to officially hand over the appliance.

“This new \$368,000 Category 1 tanker will assist volunteers in the Tuncurry Brigade to provide an even greater level of fire protection for their local community,” Mr Bromhead said.

“The NSW Government’s ongoing investment in new vehicles ensures NSW RFS members have access to modern firefighting technology when responding to fires and other incidents.”

Inspector Duckworth also thanked the 75 local volunteer members along with every volunteer in the Mid Coast District for their dedicated service to their local community.

“The efforts of our volunteers do not go unnoticed, and this new equipment will support the brigade to continue their outstanding work,” he said.

“These men and women remain on-hand 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and we should be extremely proud and grateful for their contribution.
