LEGEND



An area betweeen a bushfire hazard and buildings or other structures that is kept clear of bushfire fuels and obstructions to firefighting (also known as a Fire Break).

Strategic Fire Advantage Zone (SFAZ)

An area in which vegetation types that affect fire spread and intensity are deliberately reduced through methods such as burning or grazing.

Land Management Zone (LMZ) Prescribed Burn

An area in which prescribed burning is currently scheduled to reduce bushfire fuel and provide optimum conditions for biodiversity.

Transport Corridor Fire Break (TCFB)

An area alongside road or rail corridors in which bush fire fuel is reduced to lower ignition potential and limit fire spread.

Resident Preparation Area An area in which residents prepare themselves and their property for fire.

Fire Trail

A road specifically built for the purpose of accessing a property or area for fire management activities such as building containment lines or backburning operations during a bushfire.
