# **COVID-19 FACT SHEET**

### **NSW RFS Site and Appliance Cleaning**

#### **Principles**

- > Cleaning is an essential part of disinfection of the Coronavirus (COVID-19). Studies suggest that coronaviruses (including preliminary information on the COVID-19 virus) may persist on surfaces for a few hours or up to several days. This may vary under different conditions, which include the type of surface and the temperature or humidity of the environment. (World Health Organization).
- > Risk minimisation includes the use of appropriate Personal Protective Equipment and Clothing (PPE/PPC) and use of appropriate cleaning techniques and products.
- > Handwashing remains the primary prevention for the spread of COVID-19. It must be done properly with soap and water. When soap and water are not available, the next best option is to use an alcohol-based hand sanitiser.

#### Actions and Advice

> There are three (3) TYPES OF CLEANING to be undertaken for NSW RFS sites and appliances

Cleaning Type	Description	Level of Risk
General	Occurs on a regular basis to minimise COVID-19 exposure or spread, but there is no specific known threat of COVID-19 at the site.	Lower risk of exposure and spread of COVID-19 or other respiratory disease.
Preventative	Occurs when a person at the site has displayed flu- like symptoms and is going home to see a medical professional.	Medium risk of exposure and spread of COVID-19 or other respiratory disease.
Targeted	Occurs when a person at the site has a confirmed positive test for COVID-19, or is diagnosed as having COVID-19 by a medical professional.	Higher risk of exposure and spread of COVID-19.

> The PPE/PPC REQUIREMENTS for each cleaning type are outlined below.

- There are three (3) types of precautions for COVID-19 (Contact Precautions, Droplet Precautions, and Airborne Precautions).
- > When cleaning, NSW RFS is using Contact Precautions, as there is no exposure to airborne or droplets.
  - NSW RFS issued mask and eye protection act as barriers to people inadvertently touching their face with contaminated hands and fingers, whether gloved or not. (Source: Environmental cleaning and disinfecting principles Version 1 (10/03/2020) Coronavirus disease (COVID-19), Australian Government Department of Health.)
- Note: Whilst P2 masks are suitable for cleaning, they should be reserved for fire related incidents where smoke particulates are present. NSW RFS provides disposable surgical masks for cleaning and general use at non fire related incidents and activities as required. Surgical masks and Disposable P2 masks are single use items and it is important that they are disposed of in general waste once they become used, damaged or contaminated.
- > The CLEANING PRODUCTS required for all cleaning types are outlined below.
  - > Buckets
  - Mops
  - > Paper towels
  - > Disposable cloths (e.g. Chux)
  - > Cleaning product suitable for general cleaning of surfaces (e.g. Spray & Wipe or soapy water)
  - > Disinfectant specific for germ sanitisation (e.g. Pine O Cleen or Dettol)
  - > Non-leak plastic bags (e.g. garbage bags).
- > The CLEANING PROCESS for each cleaning type is described on the following pages.

## Type 1: General cleaning

All NSW RFS facilities require general cleaning on a regular basis (dependent on usage), involving existing cleaning methods plus a focus on disinfectant wiping of high use and touch point areas.

## Type 2: Preventative cleaning

This type of cleaning occurs when a person at the site has displayed flu-like symptoms and is going to see a medical professional. It involves the immediate area and surrounding 2 metres from where the person had been working.

### Type 3: Targeted cleaning

This circumstance requires a complete enhanced cleaning process that decontaminates a defined work area of five (5) metres of where the infected person was working or spent time and this needs to include common areas they may have visited. It is important to talk with the infected person (over the phone) and any other person who can define their movements. The following describes the Targeted COVID-19 Cleaning process when undertaken by a NSW RFS member.
