Long Service of Hay Headquarters Brigade members celebrated

The dedication and commitment of 50 RFS volunteers from the Hay Headquarters Brigade will tonight be recognised with the presentation of Long Service Medals.

RFS Chief Superintendent Kelwyn White will join the members and their family and friends at the Brigade Station to present the awards to volunteers who have given a total of more than 1,550 years of dedicated service to their community.

"With years of service ranging from 10 to 52 years, many of these volunteers have dedicated a significant portion of their life to protecting others, and for that we say thank you" Chief Superintendent White said.

"I would like to make special mention of Ronald Headon AFSM, who tonight will be recognised for an impressive 52 years' service

"Ron was the first Captain to be appointed of the Hay Headquarters Brigade in 1992; a position he held until 2013.

"The RFS members being celebrated tonight have and continue to give their time, to not only protect their communities, but to carry out critical behind-the-scenes work, which enables our frontline firefighters to do their job.
