Riverina Anglican College celebrates first cadet class of 2019

Nineteen students from Riverina Anglican College will celebrate their successful completion of the NSW Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS) Secondary School Cadet Program tomorrow.

The group is the first to graduate from the course this year.

The Hon. Wes Fang MLC and NSW RFS Operational Officer Bradley Stewart both praised the students who took part in the 10 week program, which began in October last year.

"The course introduces participants to the important role of volunteer firefighters within the community and provides them with skills that will last a lifetime," Mr Fang said.

"Students were taught fire behaviour and essential fire safety techniques, and gained an appreciation of the work our emergency services do every day in this state.

"Last year, 850 students completed the cadet program which also offers participants the opportunity to build their confidence and experience the camaraderie that comes with volunteering."

Operational Officer Stewart thanked Riverina Anglican College for offering the NSW RFS Secondary School Cadet Program to its students for the first time.

"It's great to see genuine enthusiasm for this important community based program," Operational Officer Stewart said.

Operational Officer Stewart also paid tribute to the volunteers and staff from the Riverina Zone who facilitated the course.
