## **Quirindi High School cadet firefighters celebrate graduation**

Nineteen students from Quirindi High School were congratulated today by NSW Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS) Assistant Commissioner Stuart Midgley AFSM for their successful completion of the NSW RFS Secondary School Cadet Program.

Assistant Commissioner Midgley said the program is the ideal way to introduce young people to the important role volunteer firefighters play within communities.
