## NSW RFS members recognised for their continued dedication

Region West members were today honored by the NSW Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS) for their ongoing commitment to the local community at a special ceremony held at the Cudgegong Fire Control Centre.

Three members were presented with Long Service Medals by NSW RFS Senior Assistant Commissioner Bruce McDonald AFSM.

"Michael is currently a member of the Winmalee Brigade and since early this year has held the position of Temporary District Assistant for the North West Zone.
