Rural Fire Service leaders descend on Dubbo

Two hundred NSW Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS) volunteers and staff will discuss and exchange ideas about leadership at the 2015 Leadership Forum which begins today at Dubbo.

The theme of the three day forum is *Leading for Success*, which focuses on how an individual leader can make a difference and ensure success for themselves, their Brigade and the Service.

NSW RFS Commissioner Shane Fitzsimmons said the forum is an ideal opportunity for members to expand their professional development while sharing their own experience and knowledge with peers from across the State.

"This forum brings our leaders together and presents an opportunity to discuss key issues pertaining to leadership from a brigade level through to senior organisational management," Commissioner Fitzsimmons said.
