After joining the brigade when it was first formed in 1960, 'Pappy' continues to regularly attend callouts. He also keeps the brigade equipment well maintained as well as keeping a check on vehicle maintenance.

"Pappy McLennan epitomises the ethos of the Rural Fire Service; a hard working, professional and dedicated volunteer who works tirelessly for their community.

"The team, led by Captain McLennan, responds to more than 250 fires each year, along with around 70 motor vehicle incidents and a further 80 calls for assistance.

"These Brigade members are also committed to helping their colleagues in other areas, sending their specialist personnel to fires throughout the State and in Queensland and Victoria.
