"The Corinella Brigade is understandably thrilled that they now have this space, which includes a single bay, transportable shed and water tank.

"The NSW RFS is committed to providing volunteer firefighters with the equipment they need to carry out the important work they do to protect their local communities.

"Today, members of this Brigade continue to protect their community from bush and grass fires as well as a diverse array of incidents.

"These men and women remain on-hand 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and we should be extremely proud and grateful for their contribution."
