Celebration for graduating Kiama High School cadets

Twenty-two students and one teacher from Kiama High School will today be congratulated for their successful completion of the NSW Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS) Secondary School Cadet Program, at a special ceremony held at the Illawarra District Fire Control Centre.

NSW RFS District Manager Superintendent Greg Wardle will praise the students and teacher who completed the program, noting it is the ideal way to introduce young people to the important role volunteer fire fighters play within communities.

"These cadets have completed a ten week course that has given them skills which will last a lifetime," Superintendent Wardle said.

"As well as examining fire behaviour, the participants have been taught essential fire safety techniques and gained an appreciation of the work our emergency services do every day in this State.

"The cadet program also offers students the opportunity to experience firsthand the commitment and camaraderie that comes with volunteering."

Superintendent Wardle said this is the fourth year that Kiama High School has offered the NSW RFS Secondary School Cadet Program to its students.

Superintendent Wardle will also pay tribute to the volunteers and staff from the Illawarra District who facilitated the course.
