Canobolas volunteer firefighters recognised

NSW Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS) Region West Manager Paul Smith congratulated some of the most longstanding volunteers in the Conobolas area for their on-going dedication and loyalty.

At the ceremony held in their honour, Mr Smith presented 28 volunteers with Long Service Medals and paid tribute to their professionalism.

"The diverse array of ladies and gentlemen receiving medals today all have one thing in common, they are highly trained, professional firefighters who freely give of their time to hone their skills, respond to emergencies and educate the public about fire.

"Both of these gentlemen decided in their teens that they wanted to help protect their neighbours' properties from fire and have continued to commit their time and energy to all facets of brigade life ever since.

"I'd like to extend my gratitude to this exceptional group of ladies and gentlemen who are driven by the desire to protect their community during times of emergency. It's an admirable trait and they should be regarded as pillars of the Canobolas area," said Mr Smith.
