Fourteen students from Lake Munmorah High have been presented with graduation certificates after successfully completing the NSW Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS) Secondary Schools Cadet Program.

Assistant Commissioner Keith Harrap presented the cadets with their graduation certificates during a ceremony at Lake Munmorah High School.
